

# The Impact of Catholic Charities in Our Communities

Even in the most caring environments, dementia can have devastating consequences on a patient's quality of life. Memory loss, confusion, and difficulty communicating are just a few of the ways this disease can make caring for oneself more challenging. Many of us are blessed with friends and family who would help us in our time of need. However, who comes to the aid of those whose support system has turned against them, taking away their right to a safe and healthy life?

When 74-year-old Sharon was found to be suffering from not only severe dementia, but abuse at the hands of those who were supposed to care for her, Catholic Charities Eldercare Options stepped in on her behalf. Sharon lived in a home willed to her by her mother. Her daughters moved in with her as the disease worsened. Not to help her cope with her increasingly challenging day-to-day life, but to take advantage of her vulnerability. Over the course of their time living with her, the home became uninhabitable. Her cabinets were torn from the walls, and even her front door was gone. With her home destroyed, Sharon had no choice but to move with her daughters into a camper without water, air conditioning or even a bed to sleep in.

Sharon's daughters even went as far as to repeatedly abandon her at a fast food restaurant with no way home. After she began to display odd behaviors in the restaurant, the police were called. She was admitted to the hospital immediately thereafter. Eldercare Options was called to investigate the situation and determine her decisional capacity. With the cooperation of her physician, it was determined that she could no longer care for herself, her finances or her living situation.

To protect Sharon from further mistreatment, Eldercare Options began

the guardianship process. Her daughters were uncooperative and belligerent throughout. While Eldercare Options worked to keep Sharon from returning to a life of abuse, her daughters lashed out one final time, forging her signature and removing thousands of dollars from her retirement account. This instance was reported to the state attorney's office.

Sharon never had to spend another night in that camper. Thanks to Eldercare Options, she finally received the medical attention and safety she deserved. This is just one example of Catholic Charities' life-changing impact across our diocese.

Interim Area Director Greg Fritzgerald retired after 25 years of service to Catholic Charities. Amanda Honn is our new Decatur Area Director. TThe Decatur office started renovations in January 2023.

Meals on Wheels had another fantastic year! Our team began offering weekend meals to clients identified as nutritionally in need. We purchased a new van, bringing the total number of vans in our fleet to 5. Plus, we plan to update all vans with fresh, new logos. Through our partnership with DMH and Chef David, we added some variety to our Meals on Wheels menu. This winter, we delivered 207 emergency frozen meals in anticipation of severe weather. With the help of Ameren Illinois, we delivered holiday meals on both Thanksgiving and Christmas. Congregate Meals on Wheels bloomed in 2022. Our program now has 3 sites: The Oxford House, The Woods, and the Senior Center. We offer monthly birthday celebrations, regular guest speakers, quarterly brunch and soup and salad events. This year also marks the first Christmas party at all three locations. It is a joy to build community at these locations.

Springfield Highlights

Each year, the Catholic Elementary schools hold a competition to collect non-perishable food items for the Holy Family Food Pantry. This year the winning school was St. Agnes. The food collected stocks the food pantry as we enter our busiest season. The Holy Family Food Pantry was in high demand throughout the 2022 holiday season. They served 425 households with Thanksgiving food baskets and 240 with Christmas food baskets. The annual Christmas Toy Store served 498 children. Overall, it was a lively year for the Holy Family Food Pantry, serving 6,466 individuals. The Crisis Assistance program served two times as many people as the previous year.

# Catholic Children's Home Highlights

The Catholic Children's Home in Alton continues to care for children with emotional and behavioral challenges, including autism. ProCare Health fulfilled the Christmas lists and provided Christmas Eve dinner for 27 children this year. The Center to Heal and Achieve at the Catholic Children's Home allows children to attend school at the center. The students receive specialized academic and intervention services.

In addition to their special day school, CCH has a residential program (McNicholas Home), and an independent and transitional living program (L.I.F.T.). These programs serve youth ages 11 to 18 in the McNicholas Home and ages 17 to 21 in L.I.F.T. The Catholic Children's Home currently serves 57 children.

St. John's Breadline Highlights

In 2022, multiple agencies blessed the St. John's Breadline with monetary and food donations, including United Way, Midwest Foodbank, The Eisenberg Foundation, St. John's Hospital, DOT Foods, and HOI Vending in addition to donations from individuals, parishes, and churches. Community grocers, including Gordon Food Service, Schnuck's, County and Harvest Market and Humphrey's donated food throughout the year. The Breadline was coined the "food recyclers of Springfield" as staff used donated goods to create healthy and delicious meals

prepared with love for guests. Bank of Springfield, St. John's College of Nursing, SIU, St. John's Lutheran Church, Merrill-Lynch, Christ the King Parish and many other groups served the less fortunate with faith, dignity, and respect at the Breadline this year.

St. John's Breadline provided hot meals every day for hundreds of people. Guests dined, fellowshipped, and socialized in a warm, positive environment for the first time since 2020 as in-door dining and breakfast resumed this year. The Breadline hosts multiple fundraisers for their program, including the Souper-Bowl semi-annual fundraiser, the Esper Figueras Memorial Golf Outing and Breadline Sunday. A new partnership with DOT Foods and MJ Kellner provided thousands of pounds of donated food and fresh produce. The Breadline operated The Eisenberg Take What You Need pantry, which provided over 400,000 pounds of food for guests to take home for additional meals. The St. John's Food Pantry provided 150,531 meals to the most vulnerable members of our community.

# 2022 PROGRAMS

#### **Bingocize**

Bingocize<sup>®</sup> is a 10-week, evidence-based fall prevention program that combines exercise and health information with the familiar game of bingo, which has shown to be a great, fun way to get seniors moving and socializing.

### **Catholic Charities Legal Services**

This community-based, quality legal services program helps people with little to no income in obtaining pro bono legal assistance in civil matters from area lawyers in specialized fields.

#### **Catholic Children's Home**

The Alton-based home provides special education and therapeutic services for students ages 5-21 and residential services to boys ages 11-18. Educational services include programming designed specifically for children with autism.

#### **Crisis Assistance**

We provide emergency financial assistance for rent and utilities, as well as providing basic necessities including diapers or hygiene products.

#### **Education and Advocacy**

Catholic Charities works with other agencies to find opportunities that will most benefit the client.

### **Eldercare Options**

Assesses, counsels, and determines the need for guardianship for the alleged disabled adults who no longer have the ability to make sound judgments on their own behalf. We also strive to find alternatives to guardianship as well as secure sound decisionmakers on behalf of disabled adults.

### **Elderly Guardianship**

We assume guardianship of seniors and provide decision-making and advocacy for elderly adults who lack the ability to make proper judgments concerning their health, well-being, and safety.

#### **Faith in Action**

Volunteers are matched with homebound seniors, age 55 and older, in Macon County to provide companionship and nonmedical assistance. Faith in Action is to help seniors maintain an independent lifestyle in their own homes.

#### **Food Pantries**

Our staff serves the nutritional needs of families by helping with immediate problems and searching for future solutions. Donations of food, time, and money are necessary in order to respond to local hunger.

### **Health Connect**

Health Connect is a comprehensive intervention program that works with clients who have a high number of hospital emergency room readmissions due to poor health, self-management skills, lack of resources or other social and emotional challenges.

### **Intact Family Services**

This program aims to keep troubled families together by offering them intense case management and education in parenting, and linking them with related services in their communities. This program is referral based only from DCFS.

#### **Meals on Wheels**

Lunches are delivered on weekdays by caring volunteers to homebound seniors in Decatur and Macon County.

### **Meals on Wheels Congregate**

The Meals on Wheels Congregate program is designed for older adults to eat a nutritious meal and socialize with friends. The program is for seniors 60 years of age and older to enjoy a hot, healthy lunch served in a group setting. Special activities/ speakers are routinely scheduled.

#### MedAssist

A prescription medicine assistance program that aids clients with securing immediate or long-term medications at free or substantially reduced costs. The following services also fall under our MedAssist program: Senior Health Insurance Program, Marketplace Certified Application Sites, Immediate Meds, the Dental Voucher Program, and Medical Equipment Loan Program. These specific program offerings vary by site.

### **Mobile Food Pantry**

Through this hunger relief effort, a refrigerated truck delivers a supply of food to pre-registered individuals and families in rural communities throughout the Springfield Diocese.

#### **Post-Adoption Services**

The Post Adoption program is designed to support and strengthen the lives of adoptive parents, adult adopted persons and birth parents by providing compassionate profiles, searches and intermediary services.

### **Professional Counseling Solutions**

Our therapists offer professional, compassionate services to individuals, couples and families striving for emotional wellness. We also provide counseling to foster children, students and women in crisis pregnancies.

#### **Ramblin' Rose**

The Ramblin' Rose Bus, a ministry sponsored by Effingham Catholic Charities, will travel to towns in the seven-county area this summer to deliver school supplies and clothing. The program is designed to provide assistance to families with limited financial means, who qualify for free or reduced school lunches.

#### **Resale Stores**

Our stores are ideal places to find gently worn clothing, housewares, and furniture at nominal costs, and much is given away for free. Volunteers and community donations help keep our stores going strong. Hundreds of families are provided with free clothing and household items every year.

#### St. John's Breadline

Operating in Springfield since 1925, our Breadline serves hot and nutritious meals daily at no charge to low income and homeless individuals in our community.

#### St. Anne Residence

A beautiful 23-unit apartment community in Beardstown for lowincome seniors needing a safe, warm place to call home. The St. Anne Residence opened in 2005.




